## **History Intent Statement**

History has always played a key role at St Jude's; it is one of the driver subjects used across the curriculum to enrich and deepen the children's learning. We deliver a broad and enriching sequence of lessons centred on key questions which develop content knowledge through enquiry-based activities.
