# St Jude's C of E Junior School

## UNIFORM POLICY

*This school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.*

All children are requested to wear uniform as it adds to the spirit of the school community. Items of uniform which display the St Jude's School logo are available through our supplier: **JANET'S**, St Jude's Road, Englefield Green.

Items of second-hand uniform are also available through the school and sales are held periodically.

Please ensure that **ALL** uniform is **CLEARLY LABELLED** with your child's name – it makes returning mislaid items so much easier.

The full school uniform is as follows:

Grey skirt, trousers, shorts or culottes (no jersey material for trousers)

White shirt (not polo t-shirt)

School tie (gold)

Navy blue cardigan or V-neck jumper (with logo)

Navy blue/white gingham summer dress

Grey or white socks (not trainer socks) or tights

Sensible black shoes

Navy blue polo shirt for P.E. (with logo)

Navy blue P.E. shorts

School sweatshirt (with logo) and jogging trousers (for P.E. only)

Trainers

Swimming costume or swimming trunks, swimming hat (summer term only)

## HAIR

Any pupils with long hair must wear it tied back. Hair ribbons to be blue or white.  
Hair cuts must not include logos or insignia shaved into them.  
Hair styles commonly referred to as 'Mohawk' are not suitable.  
Hair must not be coloured.

## SCHOOL BAGS

We have our own school rucksacks embossed with our school logo which is available from JANET's along with the other items of uniform.

We ask that the children use these bags or a plain navy small rucksack and do not bring in large backpacks or holdalls, due to space restrictions in the cloakrooms.

## JEWELLERY

Jewellery should not be worn, with the exception of watches (**no smart watches please**) and ear studs (not dangly earrings) for children with pierced ears. Jewellery can be dangerous to both wearer and to other children; it can also cause the child considerable distress if an item of sentimental value is lost.

Earrings must be removed for P.E. – again, for safety reasons. The school policy is that children remove their own earrings. School staff will not remove earrings. If your child cannot remove their own earrings, please ensure this is done at home prior to school.

## PIERCED EARS

When a child has their ears pierced, the studs may not be removed for up to six weeks after the initial piercing; if this is done in term time it will necessarily mean that the child will miss a considerable amount of P.E. If you agree to your child having his/her ears pierced, please have it done at the beginning of the long summer holiday so that, by the time your child returns to school, the studs can be safely and easily removed for P.E. In line with advice from the [P.E. Association](#), we do not cover up earrings with tape for P.E. as there is no guarantee that this will prevent an injury.

Nail polish and make up are not permitted.
