Remote Learning Plan

The guidance from the DfE, published on 16 August 2021, states that self-isolation is no longer required for close contacts of a person with Covid-19, if that contact is under the age of 18. Therefore, it is not anticipated that there will be a return to whole school closures nationally and class closures will be a last resort (see DfE Contingency Framework).

However, it is likely that some children will have to miss school because they have asymptomatic Covid-19. It is also possible that, should there be a major Covid-19 outbreak within school, whole classes may have to move to home learning for 10 school days. If your child is ill with Covid-19, or any other illness, they won't be expected to complete any home learning.

Who is this for?	This is for individual children who can't attend school because they have Covid-19 but don't have symptoms, so can continue to access learning at home during isolation.
