

PSHE Implementation statement



Jigsaw 3-11 offers a comprehensive Programme for Primary PSHE including statutory Relationships and Health Education, giving children relevant learning experiences to help them navigate their world and to develop positive relationships with themselves and others. JIGSAW also identifies links to British Values and SMSC, and is taught in such a way as to reflect the overall aims, values, and ethos of the school.

Jigsaw consists of six half-term units of work (Puzzles), each containing six lessons (Pieces).

Each Puzzle starts with an introductory assembly, generating a whole school focus for adults and children alike.

Term 1: Being Me in My World Term 2: Celebrating Difference (including anti-bullying) Term 3: Dreams and Goals Term 4: Healthy Me Term 5: Relationships Term 6: Changing Me (including Sex Education) Every Piece has two Learning Intentions, one specific to Relationships and Health Education (PSHE) (in purple) and the other designed to develop emotional literacy and social skills (in green).

Upper and lower school teach the same unit at the same time (at their own level), facilitating whole-school learning themes.

For the Changing Me unit, which incorporates sex education from conception to birth, the children will be taught in year groups for these lessons. (Year 4, lesson 2 – having a baby, Year 5, lesson 4 – conception and Year 6, lesson 3 – conception to birth.)

Each lesson is built upon a Charter, complementing our school values, which underpins the behaviour and respect that is the basis for each lesson. The

various teaching and learning activities are engaging and mindful of different learning styles and the need for differentiation.



The “Class Teacher” page at the start of every puzzle allows time for practitioners to consider the upcoming content. These support teachers to feel more confident in their own subject knowledge, which in turn allows them to support, scaffold and extend the learning of the children.

The PSHE lead sends out an email to class teachers with updates prior to the teaching of each puzzle to ensure that content is relevant and up to date and training opportunities are offered in order to be able to deliver each unit confidently.

At St Jude’s we also provide enrichment opportunities to contextualise learning within PSHE through fund raising, visitors, links with the community and national and international events.
