Celebrations:



We wear a poppy to remember those who gave their lives in battle. Poppies are the flowers which are on the battlefields after World War One ended.

Birthdays are the anniversary of the day on which a person was born, typically treated as an occasion to celebrate. The celebration can include a party, birthday cake and the giving of gifts.



Christmas is a Christian celebration to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Popular customs include exchanging gifts, decorating Christmas trees, attending church, sharing meals with family and friends and, of course, waiting for Santa Claus to arrive.

Bonfire Night is celebrated on 5th November each year to remember the day Guy Fawkes tried, but failed, to blow up the Houses of Parliament. We use fireworks to show the explosions that could have taken place in 1605.

Gunpowder Plot	A man called Guy Fawkes and his friends decided to try and blow up the Houses of Parliament to kill the king and other important people
Remembrance	A way to remember and show respect for people and events from the past.
Birthday	The day on which someone is born.
Christmas	Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus. Christmas Day is celebrated on 25 th December.
Christianity	A religion in which people believe that the son of God is Jesus. They also believe that Jesus was Christ.
